SCOUTING TERMS & MEETINGS

Your Scout is a member of a Cub Scout Pack

- The “pack” consists of all the dens and other leaders.
- The pack meets once a month – all Cub Scout families are invited and encouraged to attend.
- The Cubmaster and Assistant Cubmasters lead the monthly pack meeting.
- Pack meetings have games, skits, songs, special guests, ceremonies, and presentations of awards that the Scouts have recently earned.
- A parent or guardian for each Scout is expected to attend each Pack meeting.

Pack Meetings

- Usually the 1st Monday of the month (with exceptions for holidays and school breaks)
- Held at Beach Park Elementary School multi-use room
- **Address:** 1058 Shell Blvd, Foster City, CA 94404
- **Time:** 6:45 p.m. to 8:00 p.m.

Your Scout is a member of a Cub Scout Den

- Dens are organized by grade level.
 - Kindergarten = Lion
 - 1st Grade = Tiger
 - 2nd Grade = Wolf
 - 3rd Grade = Bear
 - 4th Grade = Webelos (stands for “we’ll be loyal scouts”)
 - 5th Grade = Arrow of Light
- Each Den generally meets at least once per month.
- The Den is led by a Den Leader (parent volunteer) and occasionally an Assistant Den Leader (parent volunteer).
- During Den Meetings, Scouts will work on advancement requirements for their next rank.
- Den meetings also have games, crafts, songs, ceremonies, and lots of fun.
- A parent or guardian for each Scout is expected to attend each Den meeting.

Den Meetings

- Usually the 2nd Monday of the month (with exceptions for holidays and school breaks)
- Location and time decided by the Den Leader

GETTING STARTED

All Pack communication is done primarily through Slack

- Download the Slack app from the [App Store for iPhone](#) or for [Android Devices](#)
- Create an account with your preferred email address
- **Set your notifications to on.** This important! We want you to receive push notifications for all direct messages and channel messages.
 - This can be done by clicking on your photo thumbnail in the upper right hand corner and clicking “Notifications”
- Contact our New Member Coordinator to have your email added to our Pack 447 Workspace. (See page 4 for contact info, or ask in person)
- Join the following channels:

 - #calendar-events
 - The channel for your child’s Den (e.g., #den-1-aol)
 - Any others you find interesting
- Set your screen name to “Your name” / “Your child’s name”

- *We do nearly all communication via Slack, so please be diligently checking.*



All Participants must fill out Scouting America’s Medical Form Parts A and B

- In case of an emergency, Scouting America requires all **Scouts, Leaders, and Parents** to fill out a medical form each year. The forms are needed in the event of an accident to receive insurance reimbursement.
- Medical forms will be held in a secure folder and brought to every activity. Outdated forms will be destroyed.
- Forms must be **printed**. Sending digital copies via email is *not* HIPAA-compliant, so please hand them to the New Member Coordinator in person. **Forms are due 30 days after registering with the Pack.**

Awards, Rank Adventures, and Event Reminders are all through Scoutbook

- Go to <https://advancements.scouting.org/> and create a shortcut on your phone's home page:
 - **For iPhone:**
 - 1) Go to the Safari app on your iPhone.
 - 2) Go to the website you want to add to your Home Screen. Tap "share" (box in arrow) button in the menu bar.
 - 3) Scroll down the list of options, then tap Add to Home Screen.
 - 4) If you don't see Add to Home Screen, you can add it. Scroll down to the bottom of the list, tap Edit Actions, then tap "+ Add to Home Screen."
 - **For Android:**
 - 1) Open your web browser, such as Google Chrome.
 - 2) Go to the website you want to save. Tap the three-dot menu icon in the top-right corner.
 - 3) Tap Add to Home screen or Install.
 - 4) Tap Add or Create shortcut to confirm

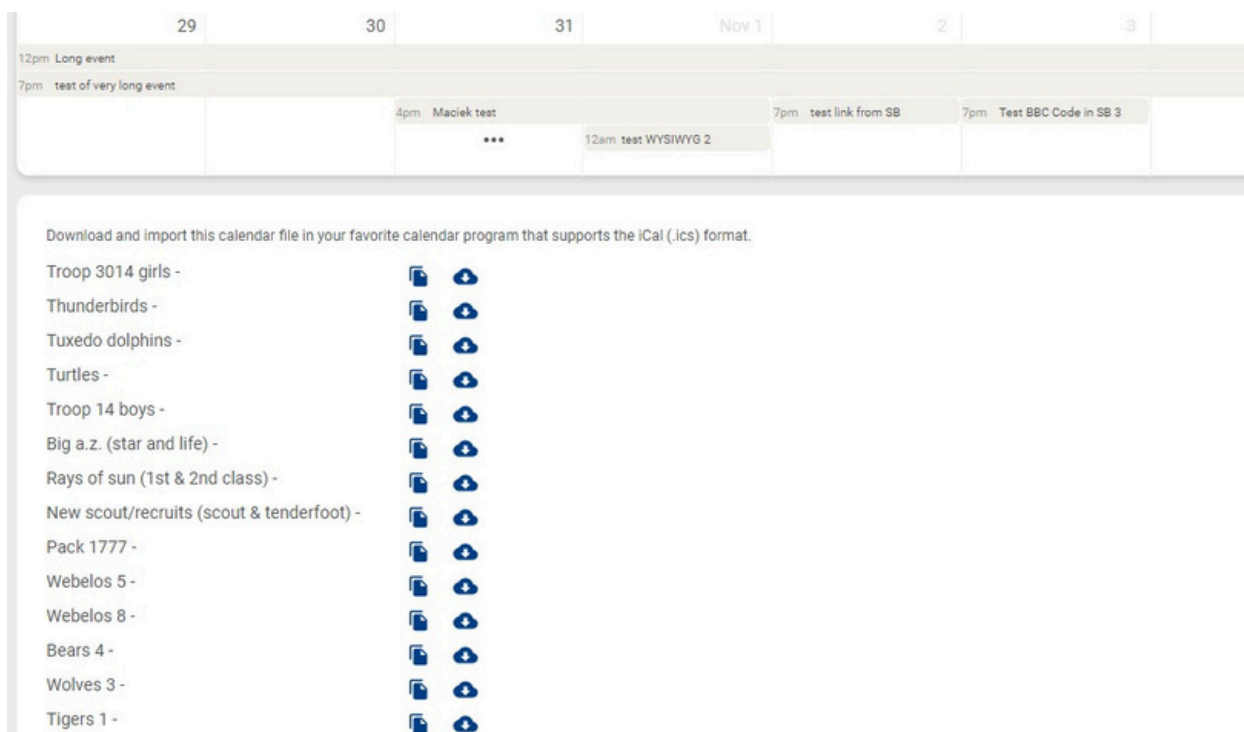

NOTE: Issues with subscriptions normally are because of how your phone or other 3rd party product works. Please check with them first if you run into difficulties.



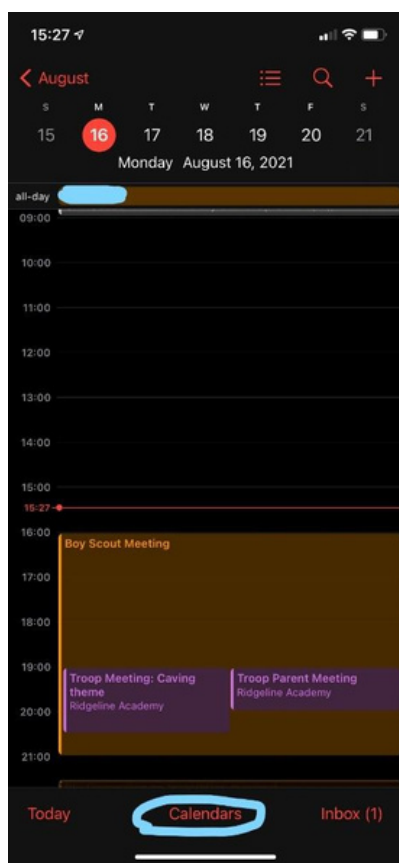

Adding Internet Advancement Calendars to Your Phone or Tablet

iOS (iPhone, iPad)

1. Go to Settings  > Calendar > Accounts > Add Account > Other.
2. Tap Add Subscribed Calendar.
3. Enter one of these URLs in the “Server” prompt:
 - a. <https://apiqa.scouting.org/advancements/events/calendar/Example98> (Pack Calendar)
 - b. <https://apiqa.scouting.org/advancements/events/calendar/Example99> (Pack Lion Den)

4. Leave all other settings as defaulted and tap Save.
5. Repeat the process for any additional calendars you want added.
6. In the Calendar App, adjust the color used to display Internet Advancement events by tapping “Calendars” at the bottom of the app, then the (i) button to the right of the subscribed calendar.

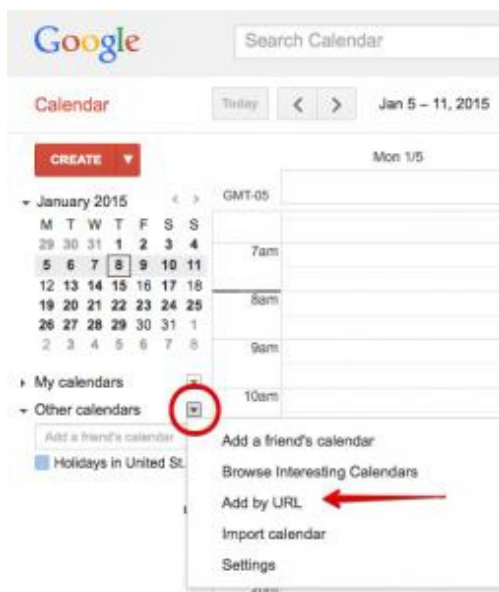

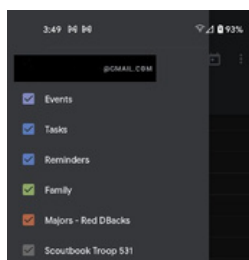
Android and Google Calendars

Calendars first need to be added to your Google Calendar on the web using the same account you sync with your phone:

1. Go to Google calendars and sign in to your account: <https://www.google.com/calendar>.
2. Click the down-arrow or + button next to **Other calendars**.
3. Select **Add by URL or From URL** from the menu.
4. Enter one of these URLs in the "URL of calendar" prompt:

5. Click **Add calendar**. The calendar will appear in the **Other calendars** section of the calendar list to the left.



6. Open the Calendar app on your phone and see if the Internet Advancement calendars show. If not, click the hamburger button  in the top left and check to see if the Internet Advancement calendar is listed and checked.



NOTE: Google Calendar updates subscribed calendars every 24 hours.

PAYING PACK DUES

Scouting is a valuable program, and with value comes the financial investment needed to keep it running smoothly. Please review the information below about 2026/27 National and Pack dues.

National and Council Dues:

- \$85/year paid to the national organization Scouting America
- \$85/year paid to the Pacific Skyline Council
- \$5.55 administrative fee
- Total: \$175.55

These expenses cover big-ticket items such as council staff, facilities, leadership training programs, outdoor camping sites for scouting, insurance, and more. This fee is paid annually. Scouting America will begin sending you reminders 60 days prior to your 12-month expiration date.

Note: *Our pack sees none of this money.* All of it goes to Scouting America or Pacific Skyline Council

Pack 447 Dues: \$250 for the whole school year.

Covers: materials, space rentals, pinewood derby cars, den meetings, pack meetings, neckerchief, slide, leadership fees, and more.

Dues can be paid the following ways:

- \$250 by cash, personal check, or money order
- \$258 (includes a 3% transaction fee) directly to our Pack PayPal account @fcpack447
 - The email address for the account is hello@fcpack447.org

Payment Deadline

Pack dues must be paid within **30 days** of registration to continue participating in Pack and Den activities. Likewise, your Scout will only receive additional materials (like neckerchief, slide, workbooks, etc.) *after* pack dues are paid.

If you need assistance or would like to discuss payment arrangements, please contact our Treasurer, Ben Joseph, at ben@fcpack447.org. We are happy to work with families whenever possible.

Additional Activity Fees: Our pack occasionally hosts activities, such as tours or campouts, that incur additional costs, and participation is completely optional. For example, tickets to the minor-league hockey games our pack has previously attended were \$28/ticket for center ice.

Tiger Rank (1st Grade) to Webelos (4th Grade)

- These Scouts wear:
 - a [BLUE](#) Cub Scout Short-Sleeve Uniform Shirt (see image)
 - **Tip:** buy a size or two up so it can last all four years
 - [BLUE](#) Cub Scout Cut-to-Fit Uniform Belt ([LINK](#))
 - Neckerchief and slide (provided by the Pack once Pack dues are paid)



We only ask that you purchase the button-up shirt and belt. BSA shorts/pants and hat are optional. A pair of nice shorts or jeans will suffice.

Arrow of Light [AOLs] (5th grade)

- AOL Scouts wear:
 - a [TAN](#) Scouts BSA Uniform Short Sleeve Shirt (see image)
 - **Tip:** this is the shirt that continues on to Scouts BSA (older scouts, Troop level) beyond elementary school.
 - The shirt comes in male and female options
 - [GREEN](#) Scouts BSA Uniform Belt, Cut to Size ([LINK](#))
 - Neckerchief and slide (provided by the pack once Pack dues have been paid)
 - [GREEN](#) Scouts BSA Switchback Uniform Pant ([LINK](#)), or similar.
 - Unlike other ages, the green pants are *highly encouraged* as they are required for Scouts BSA
 - Leaders have purchased pants in the same color from other websites like Prana, Amazon, etc.

Informed Consent, Release Agreement, and Authorization

I understand that participation in Scouting activities involves the risk of personal injury, including death, due to the physical, mental, and emotional challenges in the activities offered. Information about those activities may be obtained from the venue, activity coordinators, or your local council. I also understand that participation in these activities is entirely voluntary and requires participants to follow instructions and abide by all applicable rules and the standards of conduct.

In case of an emergency involving me or my child, I understand that efforts will be made to contact the individual listed as the emergency contact person by the medical provider and/or adult leader. In the event that this person cannot be reached, permission is hereby given to the medical provider selected by the adult leader in charge to secure proper treatment, including hospitalization, anesthesia, surgery, or injections of medication for me or my child. Medical providers are authorized to disclose protected health information to the adult in charge, camp medical staff, camp management, and/or any physician or health-care provider involved in providing medical care to the participant. Protected Health Information/Confidential Health Information (PHI/CHI) under the Standards for Privacy of Individually Identifiable Health Information, 45 C.F.R. §§160.103, 164.501, etc. seq., as amended from time to time, includes examination findings, test results, and treatment provided for purposes of medical evaluation of the participant, follow-up and communication with the participant's parents or guardian, and/or determination of the participant's ability to continue in the program activities.

(If applicable) I have carefully considered the risk involved and hereby give my informed consent for my child to participate in all activities offered in the program. I further authorize the sharing of the information on this form with any BSA volunteers or professionals who need to know of medical conditions that may require special consideration in conducting Scouting activities.

With appreciation of the dangers and risks associated with programs and activities, on my own behalf and/or on behalf of my child, I hereby fully and completely release and waive any and all claims for personal injury, death, or loss that may arise against the Boy Scouts of America, the local council, the activity coordinators, and all employees, volunteers, related parties, or other organizations associated with any program or activity.

I also hereby assign and grant to the local council and the Boy Scouts of America, as well as their authorized representatives, the right and permission to use and publish the photographs/film/videotapes/electronic representations and/or sound recordings made of me or my child at all Scouting activities, and I hereby release the Boy Scouts of America, the local council, the activity coordinators, and all employees, volunteers, related parties, or other organizations associated with the activity from any and all liability from such use and publication. I further authorize the reproduction, sale, copyright, exhibit, broadcast, electronic storage, and/or distribution of said photographs/film/videotapes/electronic representations and/or sound recordings without limitation at the discretion of the BSA, and I specifically waive any right to any compensation I may have for any of the foregoing.

Every person who furnishes any BB device to any minor, without the express or implied permission of the parent or legal guardian of the minor, is guilty of a misdemeanor. (California Penal Code Section 19915[a]) My signature below on this form indicates my permission.
